
### RETURN OF THE PHOTO CONTEST

### "JOIN THE E-COMMUNITY"

(reprint from May-June 2009)

Palomar Audubon Society has had a friendly e-mail message list since October 2000. This list is focused specifically on the needs and interests of PAS members and is used to post important messages, including announcements, and last minute changes to events, trip reports, with an occasional comment, boast, or query from members. Unlike many e-mail lists, this has been a "low volume" list that averages only a few messages per week so it doesn't fill up your mailbox.

**How to sign up:** This e-mail list is administered through Yahoo! Groups. There are essentially two ways for you to participate:

- As an unregistered user. In this case, all you get are the messages when they are sent. To join the email list this way send messages to: <a href="mailto:Kemer.Thomson@gmail.com">Kemer.Thomson@gmail.com</a> with your name and e-mail address. You will receive a confirmation e-mail. Don't reply to that confirmation email or you will immediately be taken off the list. Quit the group at any time by sending a message from the receiving e-mail address to:

PalomarBird-unsubscribe@yahoogroups.com

- As a registered Yahoo! user. If you have a Yahoo! mail account or belong to any other Yahoo! Groups as a registered user, this is the easiest and most powerful option: it allows you to read the archive of previous postings (seven year's worth) and to change your personal settings. To join the group this way, go to: <a href="http://groups.yahoo.com/group/PalomarBird/">http://groups.yahoo.com/group/PalomarBird/</a> and click on the "Join This Group!" button.

### **CONSERVATION NOTES**

Char Glacy

Taught a brief glimpse of the first of the season bright male Hooded Oriole at one of my hummingbird feeders the other day. It brought to mind how important backyard conservation is. Whether you live in a rural area, a suburban yard, or even a condo with a small patio, you can help protect the environment and add beauty and interest to your surroundings. Habitat is a combination of food, water, shelter, and space arranged to meet the needs of wildlife. Even a small yard can be landscaped to attract birds, butterflies, beneficial insects, and small animals.

Trees, shrubs, and other plants provide shelter and food for wildlife. The plants you use for food and cover will help determine what species you might attract. I live in an urban area but do my best to make sure the yard is designed for maximum bird use. The Toyon, with it's abundance of red berries this winter was enjoyed by a flock of Cedar Waxwings, and the hummingbird feeders kept the Anna's very busy.

It has been such a joy to watch the fountain. Birds are there most of day, and sometimes in the morning an Anna's will sit at the top of the bubbler and take a bath. I hope you are enjoying the spring as much as I am.

#### **Dear Members and Friends,**

A great <u>BIG THANKS</u> to those who have already responded to our 2011 fund raising letter. You are helping make it possible for us to continue these programs.

### Some of our accomplishments in 2010 and plans for 2011 are:

<u>BIRD WALKS</u> — We had 48 Saturday bird walks with over 900 participants. On average over 50 bird species were observed on each walk and all areas of San Diego County were visited. We continue to look for new areas to bird and to develop new walk leaders.

**PROGRAMS** – We had 7 programs on a variety of subjects presented at monthly membership meetings. Presenters ranged from experts in their field to PAS members.

**SCHOLARSHIP** – Kenny Kimbrough was the recipient of the PAS 2010 Scholarship Award. Kenny attended the week long ABA Young Birders' Conference in June in Colorado. Kenny found the conference enriching and shared his experience with our membership at an informative program. We plan on continuing the scholarship for 2011 and have identified a worthy recipient for a camp in Arizona. If possible we would like to sponsor a second child this year to one of the four available camps.

**<u>BIRD COUNTS</u>** - We participated in the Escondido Christmas Bird Count to gather yearly census information.

The count in December was very successful with a high level of participation. PAS provided lunch for all the participants.

<u>PUBLICATIONS</u> - We continue to publish "Band Tales", our newsletter, which keeps our membership informed of our meetings, programs, weekly bird walks and items of environmental interest. We are now providing an online copy of "Band Tales" at our website.

<u>ENVIRONMENTAL SUPPORT</u> - We donated to the following organizations in 2010: Wildlife Research Institute in Ramona, San Dieguito River Valley Conservancy, and Escondido Creek Conservancy. For the Wildlife Research Institute, we sponsored the purchase of a GPS device to track a Golden Eagle. We plan on making similar donations in 2011. We are also exploring ways we can provide additional non-monetary support to these worthy organizations in our community.

<u>BIRDING TRIPS OUTSIDE COUNTY</u> – We plan to continue offering these birding trips to our members. We had a very successful trip to Trinidad/Tobago this past January.

We still need your help to meet our financial goals for 2011. We are successful as an organization only with your help. Locations in Thomas Guide Coordinates are shown in parenthesis as (Page-Column Row). Ratings: 1=easy, suitable for all levels, 2=moderate, a bit more walking and possibly some hilly terrain, 3=challenging, longer hikes and may involve some steep terrain.

#### Saturday, May 7, 8:00 a.m.

**Daley Ranch** Escondido

(1110-C3) Rating: 2

From I-15 in Escondido, exit at El Norte Parkway and drive east approximately 3 miles. Look for the "Daley Ranch/Dixon Lake" signs and turn left (north) on La Honda Drive. Continue on toward Dixon Lake and to the free Daley Ranch parking lot on your left. Meet at the kiosk.

Saturday, May 14, 8:00 a.m.

Kit Carson Park
Escondido

(1150-C1) Rating: 1

From I-15 in Escondido, exit east on Via Rancho Parkway and drive about 1 mile to Park Road entrance on your left — at the fire station. Proceed on Park Road about <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> mile to the Amphitheater parking lot on the right. Woodland, riparian, and open-area habitats usually get us a nice list of resident birds.

Saturday, May 21, 8:00 a.m. Wilderness Gardens Preserve Pala

(409-E6) Rating: 2

This small wilderness area represents a fine example of oak woodland habitat. Meet in the Wilderness Gardens parking lot, which is about 10 miles east of I-15 on Hwy.76, on the south side of the highway. Parking fee required. Bring a lunch for an after-birding picnic. Expect warm weather.

### **Sweetwater River Gorge**

Rancho San Diego

(1271-J6) Rating: 2-3

From I-5, I-805, or I-15, take Hwy. 94 east; stay on Hwy. 94 as it becomes Campo Road, then turn right on Singer Lane, and then an immediate left onto the dirt parking area near the old steel bridge. This area is a rich stream habitat surrounded by native chaparral and sage scrub. There are no restrooms or drinking water available, so plan accordingly. Expect warm weather. It's a PAS tradition to eat at Rubio's after birding.

Saturday, June 4, 8:00 a.m.

#### William Heise County Park/Santa Ysabel Mission Julian

(1156-C5) Rating: 2-3

From Escondido take Hwy 78 east (from San Diego take Hwy 67 east) to Ramona, then Hwy 78 toward Julian, past Santa Ysabel. At Wynola start looking for the sign for William Heise Park (1 mile west of Julian). Turn right on Pine Hill Road and drive south for 2 miles to Frisius Road. Turn left (east) onto Frisius Road and drive for another 2 miles to the park entrance. We will meet in the parking lot. There is a parking fee. We will also drive to Santa Ysabel Mission to look for orioles and other spring/summer migrants. Bring a lunch for an after-birding picnic. Expect warm weather.

Saturday, June 11, 8:00 a.m.

Agua Dulce Creek Laguna Mountains (430-B5) Rating: 3

We will meet at the old parking area for Agua Dulce Creek Group camp. Driving east on I-8, and after Pine Valley, look for signs indicating the Sunrise Highway Exit and Laguna Mountain Recreation Area. Go north on Sunrise Hwy. (S-1) to Wooded Hill Road. Take the first road on the left to the area directly across the road from Morris Ranch Road. Restrooms, picnic tables and water are available in the Lagunas at Burnt Rancheria Picnic area. A Forest Service Adventure Pass is required and is available locally at major sporting goods stores and at other areas in the Lagunas. Bring a lunch for an afterwalk picnic. Expect warm weather.

### Cuyamaca Rancho State Park Julian

(429- L3) Rating: 2-3

From San Diego, take I-8 east and exit north on Hwy 79. Continue approximately 12 miles to the Paso Pacacho Campground on the left. From the North County, take Hwy 78 (or Hwy 67) to Ramona, and then continue on Hwy 78 just past Julian, to Hwy 79. Take Hwy 79 south approximately 10 miles to the campground on the right where we will meet. There is a day use fee. Bring a lunch for an after-walk picnic. Expect warm weather.

Palomar Mountain
San Diego County
(409-G7) Rating: 2

This field trip will start from the parking lot at Doane Pond. Leave the Escondido area at about 7 a.m. From I-15, take Highway 76 east to Highway S6, north to Palomar Mountain. Or from Escondido, take Highway S6 to Palomar Mountain. At the mountaintop, at the S7 intersection stop sign, turn left and continue for 3 miles on State Park Rd. to the Palomar Mountain State Park entrance. There is a day use fee. Proceed 1.5 miles to the Doane Pond/School Camp area. Bring a lunch for an after-walk picnic. Expect warm weather.

- Go less than 1/4 mile and turn left at the "KERSEY" sign. Continue to the cul de sac and... hey, you made it!
